Leader: What do you believe about God the Redeemer?

*Confession of Faith Heidelberg Catechism, Questions 110 - 111

Leader: What does God forbid in the eighth commandment?

People: He forbids not only outright theft and robbery, punishable by law. But in God's sight theft also includes cheating and swindling our neighbor by schemes made to appear legitimate, such as: inaccurate measurements of weight, size, or volume; fraudulent merchandising; counterfeit money; excessive interest; or any other means forbidden by God. In addition he forbids all greed and pointless squandering of his gifts.

Leader: What does God require of you in this commandment?

People: That I do whatever I can for my neighbor's good, that I treat him as I would like others to treat me, and that I work faithfully so that I may share with those in need.
