Crown Him with Many Crowns by Matthew Bridges, 1851 and Godfrey Thring, 1874

"... and on His head were many crowns..."

~ Revelation 19:12

The original form of this hymn was written by Matthew Bridges and consisted of six eight-line stanzas. He thought of his hymn as a sermon in song, based on Revelation 19:12, "... and on His head were many crowns." He called his hymn, "The Song of the Seraphs." Matthew, who once wrote a book condemning Roman Catholics, ended up converting to Catholicism in 1848. He followed John Henry Newman out of the Church of England.

In 1874, Godfrey Thring, a staunch Anglican clergyman feared that some of Bridges' verses smacked too much of Catholic doctrine. Verse two, for example, said:

Crown Him the virgin's Son, the God incarnate born, Whose arm those crimson trophies won which now His brow adorn; Fruit of the mystic rose, as of that rose the stem; The root whence mercy ever flows, the Babe of Bethlehem.

It seems odd to us now that such a verse would cause controversy, but in the end Godfrey wrote six new verses for the same song. "Crown Him with Many Crowns," therefore became a six-verse hymn that was written twice!

Over the years, these twelve stanzas have become intermingled in the hymnbooks, with editors mixing and matching the verses. Here are the first lines of all twelve verses, the first six by Bridges, the last six by Thring:

- 1. Crown Him with many crowns, the Lamb upon His throne . . .
- 2. Crown Him the virgin's Son, the God incarnate born . . .
- 3. Crown Him the Lord of love, behold His hands and side . . .
- 4. Crown Him the Lord of peace, Whose power a scepter sways . . .
- 5. Crown Him the Lord of years, the Potentate of time . . .
- 6. Crown Him the Lord of Heaven, one with the Father known...
- 7. Crown Him with crowns of gold . . .
- 8. Crown Him the Song of God, before the worlds began . . .
- 9. Crown Him the Lord of light . . .
- 10. Crown Him the Lord of life, who triumphed over the grave...
- 11. Crown Him the Lord of lords, who over all doth reign . . .
- 12. Crown Him the Lord of heaven, enthroned in worlds above . . .



Note: The Trinity Hymnal uses verses 1, 3, 4 & 5. The Celebration Hymnal uses verses 1, 3, 6 & 10.




