CPC Sermon Page

Sermon Thesis: A Christian is a sinner who has become a saint by the saving <u>love</u>, sovereign <u>calling</u>, and unmerited <u>blessing</u> of the Triune God alone.

I. A Christian is one who is <u>loved</u> by God (v. 7).

II. A Christian is one who is <u>called</u> by God (vv. 6-7).
