The Nicene Creed, written in AD 325 is a good summary of the biblical and historical Christian faith

So Christian, what do you believe about the Glory and Triumph of God's Church?

We believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. . . and in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God . . . who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried; and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures. . . and we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; who spoke by the prophets . . . and we believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church; we acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins . . .

Out of the whole creation, from the beginning of the world until its end, God has called a people to Himself, whom He adopts for Himself, by the Spirit and the Word, a Church chosen in love unto eternal life according to the riches of God's grace. This one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church, as it is perceptible to us, is an assembly of visible saints, called and separated from the world, ordered, empowered, and commissioned to worship and glorify God by extending His kingdom to all nations by declaring and demonstrating the reign of Christ, its King and Head. We are the salt of the earth and the light of the

The Church, under Christ's rule, consists of those united on the basis of the gospel and the doctrines of the Scripture, not outward liturgical forms, traditional ecclesiastical structure, or any other basis however supposedly beneficial to the unity and perseverance of God's people. Thus, it is neither catholic nor apostolic to decree any teaching as an essential doctrine that is contrary or additional to that which is taught in the Scriptures alone. The true Church, under the authority of the Word, has endured and will endure until the end of time, even through many persecutions and evils within and without, for the Lord Jesus Christ declared, "I will build my Church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it". We praise the God of peace that He will soon crush Satan under our feet. In that Day the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD as the waters cover the sea, and every knee will bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
