*Confession of Faith

The Nicene Creed, Part IV

Leader: The Nicene Creed, as written in AD 325 at the Council of Nicea and revised at the Council of Constantinople in AD 381, has been affirmed by the church throughout the ages, and thus serves as a good summary of the biblical and historical Christian faith.

So Christian, what do you believe about the Gospel and the Kingdom of the Lord Jesus Christ?

People: We believe in one Lord Jesus Christ . . . who, for us men and for our salvation, came down from heaven, and was incarnate, by the Holy Spirit, of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; He suffered and was buried; and on the third day He rose again, according to the Scriptures . . . whose kingdom will have no end.

For God's glory and by His eternal plan, Jesus Christ, as the second Adam, the seed of Abraham, and the son of David, fulfilled the law and promises of God spoken through the prophets. This gospel is the good news that Jesus Christ, our Prophet, Priest, and King, died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures. And by His perfect obedience and sacrifice of Himself which He, through the eternal Spirit, once offered up to God, our Lord Jesus Christ has fully satisfied the justice of God, has procured reconciliation, and has purchased an everlasting inheritance in the kingdom of heaven for all those whom the Father has given to Him, a people born anew from every tongue, tribe, and nation, who live in humble and holy submission to the lordship of Christ, and await the consummation of the kingdom at the return of Christ and the end of the ages.

Confession of Sin Captivated by Sin

Heavenly Father, forgive us for our many sins. Like Eve, we are easily captivated by the objects that our eyes desire. You gave up your own glory to be stripped, humiliated, and shed your blood, serving us as our holy substitute.

Holy Spirit, you kept the promise of Your Word to send a Savior. Help us now trust in Christ alone. When we are tempted to sin like Adam and Eve, fix our eyes on Christ. Give us the heart of Jesus, to serve you with peaceful abandon, unconcerned about our own welfare and the opinions of men, submissive to your will, and quiet before you. Cause us to cherish and delight in Christ above all other desires, satisfied for all eternity in Him. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
