*Confession of Faith

The Nicene Creed, Part V

The Nicene Creed, as written in AD 325 at the Council of Nicea, has been affirmed by the church throughout the ages, and is a good summary of the biblical and historical Christian faith.

So Christian, what do you believe about Salvation in Christ?

We believe in one Lord Jesus Christ . . . who, for us men and for our salvation, came down from heaven, and was incarnate, by the Holy Spirit, of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; He suffered and was buried; and on the third day He rose again, according to the Scriptures . . . whose kingdom will have no end.

God made known His justice toward His Son, who was charged with our sin, and He poured out His goodness and mercy on us, giving to us His Son to die, by a most perfect love, and raising Him to life for our justification, in order that by Him we might receive righteousness, forgiveness, and eternal life. By His free and absolute grace, God gives us true knowledge of His gospel wherein He kindles in our hearts an obedience of faith that embraces Jesus Christ alone for salvation, sanctification, perseverance, and glorification. To us for whom Christ has obtained eternal redemption, God certainly and effectually applies and communicates this redemption, uniting us to Himself by His Spirit, and revealing to us in the Word and by the Word the mystery of salvation.


