*Confession of Faith

The Nicene Creed, Part II

Leader: The Nicene Creed, as written in AD 325 at the Council of Nicea and revised at the Council of Constantinople in AD 381, has been affirmed by the church throughout the ages, and thus serves as a good summary of the biblical and historical Christian faith.

So Christian, what do you believe about the Creation and the Fall?

People: We believe in one God the Father almighty; maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord Jesus Christ . . . by whom all things were made . . . And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life.

It pleased God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, for the manifestation of the glory of His eternal power, wisdom, and goodness, to create out of nothing the heavens and the earth. As God did in the beginning, so even now unto all ages He continues to sustain and govern all of creation, according to His wise, holy, eternal, almighty, and ever present providence, in such a way that nothing happens in all the universe without His knowledge and will.

Human beings, the crowning work of God's creation, were created in the image and likeness of God, in knowledge, righteousness, and holiness, with dominion over the creatures. However, by the sin of Adam, humanity fell from original righteousness and communion with God, thereby bringing physical and spiritual death to all people, and making Adam and his posterity by nature children of wrath, servants of sin, subjects of death and all other miseries, spiritual, temporal, and eternal. This inherited depravity, often called "original sin," continues to be the root of every kind of sin in us, and is so offensive in the sight of God, our holy creator, as to justly deserve His wrath and condemnation.

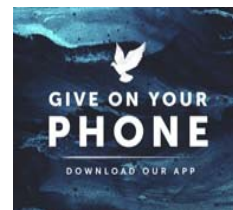
