Preparation for Worship *Thank you for silencing all electronic devices.*

“When I lived in Pennsylvania, I belonged to Latrobe Country Club. It was Arnold Palmer’s club. I met Arnold Palmer a number of times. Often I’d be on the golf course at the same time Arnold Palmer was, or we’d be in the dining room at the club at the same time. But I have never been invited to Arnold Palmer’s house for dinner. In our human relationships, just sharing a meal together is significant. But when people get close, they begin to visit back and forth in each other’s homes for the intimate fellowship of a meal. Jesus at the Lord’s Supper is saying, ‘You are coming to My house for dinner, and I’m going to give you that kind of concentration of intimacy and assurance that goes with it.’ In other words, we have a special relationship with Christ that the unbeliever does not participate in, because the Lord’s Supper is for believers only. Non-believers can come to the church and participate in the worship service, but they have no access to the Lord’s Table. That is where Jesus sits down with His people to give them special attention and to dispense a particular grace to them. He comes to comfort them, forgive them, and strengthen them.”

People: Everything taught to us in the gospel.
