Leader: Why is the Son of God called "Jesus" meaning "Savior"?

People: Because He saves us from our sins. Salvation cannot be found in anyone else;

it is futile to look for any salvation elsewhere.

Leader: Why is He called Christ, that is, Anointed?

Because He has been ordained by God the Father, and anointed with the Holy People:

> Spirit, to be our chief Prophet and Teacher, who has fully revealed to us the secret counsel and will of God concerning our redemption; our only High Priest, who by the one sacrifice of His body has redeemed us, and who continually intercedes for us before the Father; and our eternal King, who governs us by His Word and Spirit, and who defends and preserves us in the

redemption obtained for us.

Leader: Why are you called a Christian?

People: Because I am a member of Christ by faith and thus share in His anointing, so

> that I may as prophet confess His Name, as priest present myself a living sacrifice of thankfulness to Him, and as king fight with a free and good conscience against sin and the devil in this life, and hereafter reign with Him
